A robust schedule has been developed at Allen University for Summer School 2017. We will conduct the following three Summer sessions:

Maymester	(3 weeks)	May 15th - June 1st
Summer I	(4 weeks)	June 5th – June 29th
Summer II	(4weeks)	July 3rd – July 27th

If you know a high school senior that is looking for early college credits, if you want to raise your GPA, want to graduate on schedule, or graduate early, Allen is the place to be this summer. If you know of anyone looking to earn additional college credits, refer them to Allen. You do not have to be an Allen student to attend, and Financial Aid is available for those that qualify. Prices are \$300 per credit hour, and Room & Board is \$900 per session if taking 6 credits or more.

Course offerings will include Accounting, Economics, African American History, Math, Biology, Business Law, Hip Hop Culture, French, Community Health, and more.



Did You Know?

Allen University Alumnus, Luna Isaac Mishoe, established his name in theoretical and applied mathematics while living. He was born on January 5, 1917, in Bucksport, South Carolina and died in January of 1989. He received a B.S. degree in Mathematics from Allen University in 1936. He continued his education completing his M.S. degree in mathematics and physics at the University of Michigan in 1942, Ph.D. in mathematics from New York University in 1953 and postdoctoral research

in mathematics at Oxford University in England during the 1955-56 academic year.

Mishoe thrived in academia as he went on to become a professor of mathematics and physics at Kittrell College in Kittrell, North Carolina, full professor of physics at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland and the President of Delaware State University in Dover, Delaware. He was also very well -accomplished outside of academia as he did the following:

- Created mathematical methods for solving some of the problems faced by the United States in developing its first satellites.
- Served as a photographic intelligence and communication officer in the all-black 99th Squadron (Tuskegee Airmen) during World War II.
- Served as a consultant in math and ballistics for the Ballistics Research Laboratories.

Developed equations for the development of missiles and satellites.
